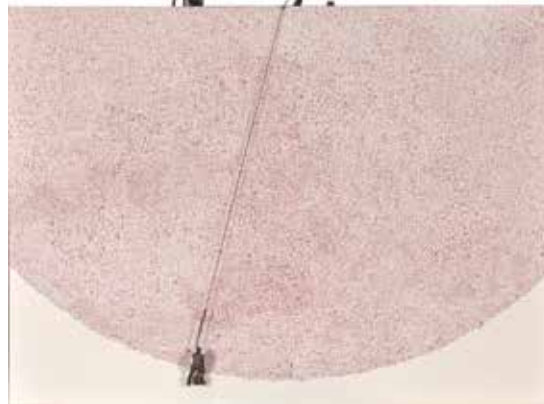

Towers of Tomorrow with LEGO® Bricks

May 7 – August 7, 2022
Main Gallery and T. S. Martin Atrium



2022 marks the 25th anniversary of the current Art Center building, designed by Skidmore, Owings & Merrill in Chicago. To celebrate the occasion, an architectural exhibition seems appropriate.

Towers of Tomorrow with LEGO® Bricks partners some of the world's most dazzling and innovative skyscrapers with the world's most popular building brick. The exhibit features 20 astonishing skyscrapers from North America, Asia, and Australia constructed in breathtaking architectural detail by Ryan McNaught, one of only twelve LEGO® certified professionals in the world. McNaught and his team of builders have used more than half a million LEGO® bricks and devoted over 2,000 hours to build the structures featured in the exhibition.

Among the buildings represented is Burj Khalifa in Dubai, the current tallest building in the world, also designed by Skidmore, Owings & Merrill. Additional towers include: Chrysler Building • Empire State Building • Infinity Tower • Marina Bay Sands • Shanghai Tower • Taipei 101 • Tokyo Skytree • Willis (Sears) Tower • Wilshire Grand Centre.

Visitors will be inspired to create their own 'towers of tomorrow' with more than 200,000 loose LEGO® bricks available in hands-on construction areas. Visitors can add their creations to a steadily rising futuristic LEGO® metropolis inside the exhibition.

Towers of Tomorrow with LEGO® Bricks is a traveling exhibition from Sydney Living Museums and toured internationally by Flying Fish.

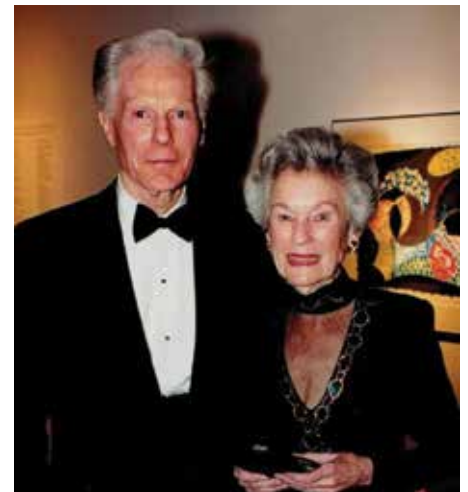

The Past



In 1914, a group of art lovers had a big dream. At its founding, the Sioux City Society of Fine Arts determined the goal, as reported then by the *Sioux City Journal*: "From a modest beginning it is hoped that the gallery will develop steadily, and promoters of the movement do not consider it an extravagant dream that the day will come when among the public buildings to which Sioux Cityans proudly will call the attention of visitors will be the 'Art Institute', or some similarly named structure." It took that small spark of an idea, over a hundred years ago, to inspire generations to work toward realizing that dream. Twenty-five years ago, on March 1, 1997, the building we know and love, our Art Center, opened to an amazed public and proud donors from all walks of life.

It took 83 years to fully complete the dream. And think of all that has happened since that dream was realized!

The Present

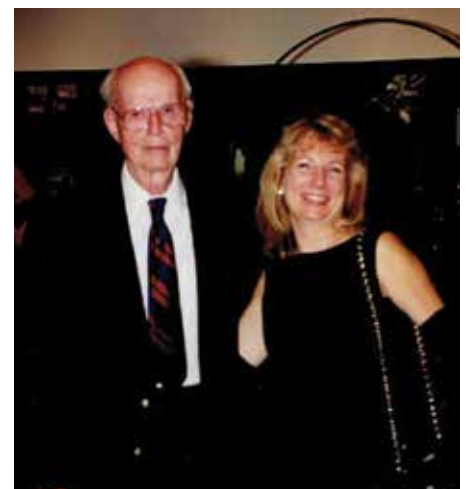

The Drive-By Gallery



Thanks to funding from the Estate of Jerry Stroup and the Gilchrist Foundation, the Art Center has partnered with four outstanding public artists from the University of South Dakota to launch a new mural program for high school students. Led by Reyna Hernandez, Sonia Perea-Morales, Yazmin Moktan, and Amber Hansen, students from Bishop Heelan, East, North, and West High School are meeting and working throughout the first five months of the year. The goal is to complete two large murals for “The Drive-By Gallery,” the walls of the Gilchrist Learning Center that face Pierce Street. While the USD artists will guide the process along, the project is intended to empower the high school artists to think seriously about the themes and ideas that are included in large, visible artworks.

The Art Center will host a celebration in June for the new murals. Stay tuned for more details!

Summer Art Camp

Also coming (back) to the Gilchrist Learning Center in June—Summer Art Camp! Parents may choose from five two-week sessions. Children may attend either half days or full days on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays of each week. Art projects differ in the morning and afternoon. Both include 2D, 3D, and clay projects. 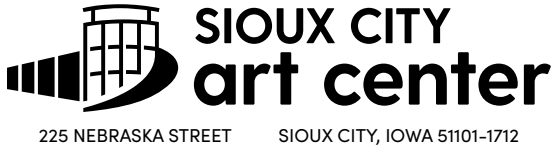
